High School Curriculum Model

- Dr. Eddie Ruiz presented the CSUSA High School model to the Board. Dr. Ruiz discussed an overview of programming that will be offered at the new high school, named Winthrop College Prep Academy which included Cambridge, AP, and Bright Futures. Vice- Chair Johnson discussed the highlights and the importance of being College Prep and that he felt strongly in pursuing a dual enrollment option with Hillsborough Community College ("HCC"). Dr. Ruiz agreed and wanted to research ways to do this without losing FTE funding. Mr. Johnson invited Dr. Ruiz to meet with at HCC to further research partnerships with HCC and the YMCA. Dr. Ruiz also invited the board to tour Don Sofer Aventura High School in April.
- Mrs. Cole was impressed and very excited for the High School as this board has advocated for years for a high school.
- Dr. Steve Knobl was impressed with the High School model and advocated a partnership with the YMCA as he has had opportunities to do that in the past when he was a high school Principal.
- Derek Kelmanson updated the board on the timing of the application with the district and that there will be parent information sessions in the coming weeks.

Dear Parents,

All educators in Florida are monitored to ensure they meet certification and training requirements as mandated by law. Per Florida Statute 1012.42, when a teacher is assigned teaching duties out of the field in which the teacher is certified, the parents of all students in the class shall be notified in writing.

Individuals who are teaching out-of-field are certified in at least one area and are qualified to teach, but are required to take additional coursework or testing to add a coverage/endorsement to their certificate. The state also requires a teacher to take coursework/in-service towards an English to Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) endorsement, when the teacher is the primary language arts provider and/or reading teacher for an ESOL student. The following table lists teachers currently out of field.
