CALL TO ORDER

Pursuant to public notice, the meeting commenced at 1:00 p.m. with a Call to Order by Chair, Valora Cole. Roll call was taken, and quorum established.

1. **ADMINISTRATIVE**

Approval of the November 4, 2021 Board Meeting Minutes

The board reviewed the meeting minutes.

MOTION: Motion was made by Eric Johnson and seconded by Dr. Steve Knobl to approve the Meeting Minutes from the November 4, 2021, FCEF BACF Board Meeting, as presented. Motion was approved unanimously. (5-0)

CSUSA REPORTS II. **State Director Report**

FCEF-BACF

COVID Update

Dr. Ruiz informed the Board that CSUSA continues to follow COVID protocol established with no changes made. Aware of new variant, and as we go on winter break and traveling may be involved, policies will be maintained, and will continue to track. Minimal cases being reported at this point and no mayor concerns.

Fall Assessments Review

Dr. Ruiz informed the Board that data was shared with the CSUSA Executive Team. ELA projected proficiencies are the same as in 2019. In Math there is a lot of work to do, yet some areas and schools have still raised their percent. Struggling schools being assisted by assuring there are enough teachers in those areas, hands-on assessments performed, and new instructional piece implemented. Turnover will improve as well as growth opportunity with the new teacher compensation which will be covered later in the meeting and more details will follow at the next board meeting.

HR Staffing Update

Dr. Ruiz informed the Board that recruiting teachers is a national issue which has affected CSUSA and though the year started with lots of vacancies, principals have spent tireless number of hours looking for candidates and that number has gone down.

Board Member Fall Survey Result

- Mrs. Weaver informed the Board that there has been a survey submitted to all stakeholders (parents, students, staff), as well as a Board Survey, and will present scores at next meeting. All schools are closed to 100% participation.
- Dr. Ruiz discussed the results for this survey on Page 39 and mentioned that top survey results are in line for previous years, school safety is within top results (rating high). In January's Principal Leadership Academy, these surveys will be analyzed a bit more to help address some of the concerns. Student Engagement rated lowest performing. For staff, local decision making is down a little and school safety as well. There is a trend with SEL (Social Emotional Learning) in an increase of discipline and responsiveness, with children not being in schools for a year and a half, protocols have had to be taught again. Loyalty is down a little too. A lot of new teachers have been hired. Students were loud/clear, showing engagement went up since they came back to school. Learning Recovery Comparison discussed.

III. FINANCIALS

Q1 FY22 Unaudited Financial Review

Ms. Walcott reviewed financials this week with Randy Walker prior to the board meeting and reviewed now with the Board the Summary of Student Enrollment, and YTD Change in Fund Balance. Informed the Board that the District reimbursed CSUSA in November 2021 what they had retained in the past. Reporting changed this current year, and more details are available as to what was sent to the Districts.

MOTION: A motion was made by <u>Randy Walker</u> and seconded by <u>Dr. Ramdas Chandra</u> to approve the Q1 FY22 Unaudited Financial Review, as presented. Motion was approved unanimously. (5-0)

Accounting Fixed Assets Policy and Procedures

Mrs. Weaver informed the Board of the policy and procedures being followed by CSUSA.

MOTION: A motion was made by <u>Dr. Ramdas Chandra</u> and seconded by <u>Dr. Steve Knobl</u> to approve the Accounting Fixed Assets Policy and Procedures for FCEF BACF, as presented. Motion was approved unanimously. (5-0)

IV. OLD BUSINESS

ESSER III Grants

Mrs. Weaver informed the Board that we are waiting to get approvals on budgets submitted to the Districts and will bring back to the Board once received.

Charter Renewal Updates

- Henderson
 - Mrs. Weaver informed the Board that the renewal is being reviewed and once we receive it back, it will go to the School Board.
- Union Park

Mrs. Weaver informed the Board that a letter was received today and will be added to board packet. It includes a 15-year renewal, and our Board Attorney Levy Williams informed the Board that there is no further need to contact the District, looking at options to provide and will provide some encouragement to resolve.

Business Development Update

- Sarasota
 - Mrs. Weaver informed the Board that a letter of intent and charter application has been filed with Sarasota and the plan is to implement by February 1st, once completed will email separately to all board members.
- Polk
 - Dr. Ruiz informed the Board that Polk has charter on shelves and is not easy to find a place in a conducive area for a charter. Anticipate applying for another charter in Polk County. Meeting Superintendent and Leadership Team soon and do not foresee any issues when dropping another application. It is better for us take the step and it does not abide us from re-applying in the future.

MOTION: A motion was made by <u>Eric Johnson</u> and seconded by <u>Dr. Ramdas Chandra</u> to resend Polk County application back to the District and submit another date, as presented. Motion was approved unanimously. (5-0)

- Winthrop Charter School
 - o Mrs. Weaver informed the Board that Winthrop is a high performing school it will be beneficial to strategically use this to grow the Board and consider what can CSUSA do in Board's behalf in that area since it will be advantageous for Board to have CSUSA find ways to capitalize these high performing schools and research and explore potential relationships with other parties to expand and bring back scenarios that are advantageous to students in this area.

MOTION: A motion was made by <u>Eric Johnson</u> and seconded by <u>Dr. Ramdas Chandra</u> to direct CSUSA to research and explore expansion of Winthrop Charter School, as presented. Motion was approved unanimously. (5-0)

- Dr. Chandra inquired about the options available to grow by promoting it with friends in the community, developer, county government, school board since high performing designation puts us in good space.
- Board Chair Valora Cole reminded the Board that Winthrop has always had a long waiting list.
- Principal Bradley Warren informed the Board that he has asked in numerous settings before and thanked Dr. Ruiz and Team for getting it in front of the board.

V. NEW BUSINESS

Total Teacher Compensation Plan

Dr. Ruiz informed the Board that the rollout of the Total Teacher Compensation Plan will go out to Principals on Monday, December 13th in the morning. This was discussed with all Board Chairs and the details of the plan will be presented to the rest of the board at the next board meeting. ESSER Funds will be used for the next 2½ years. Compensation will increase in 3 different areas and will bring details to board. It will help recruit new teachers and retain the ones already in the building, will share more details with Board at the next Board Meeting.

Out of Field Waivers

The board reviewed the Out of Field Waivers

MOTION: A motion was made by <u>Dr. Ramdas Chandra</u> and seconded by <u>Dr. Steve Kobl</u> to approve the Out of Field Waivers, as presented. Motion was approved unanimously. (5-0)

The board asked for public comments. There were no public comments.

- Dr. Ruiz requested to comment and congratulated Michael Kotkin for their results from the PSAT 10th grade students at his school outperformed the District, State, and National across the board.
- Mr. Katkin commented that teachers and students worked really hard and thanked everyone for the recognition.
- Board Chair Valora Cole commented that Mr. Katkin is committed to the school and teachers and commended him for such great results.
