CALL TO ORDER

Pursuant to public notice, the meeting commenced at 1:01 p.m. with a Call to Order by Vice Chair Dr. Ramdas Chandra. Roll call was taken, and quorum established.

I. PUBLIC COMMENTS

- Board Vice Chair Dr. Ramdas Chandra asked for public comments. There were none.

II. ADMINISTRATIVE

Approval of the September 23, 2022, Board Meeting Minutes

- The board reviewed the meeting minutes of the September 23, 2022, Florida Charter Educational Foundation, Inc. and Bay Area Charter Foundation, LLC. (“FCEF-BACF”) Meeting.

MOTION: Motion was made by Eric Johnson and seconded by Randy Walker to approve the September 23, 2022, Florida Charter Educational Foundation, Inc. and Bay Area Charter Foundation, LLC, Meeting Minutes, as presented. Motion was approved unanimously. (3-0, 2 absent)

III. CSUSA REPORTS

State Director Update

- Dr. Eddie Ruiz shared with the board updates of each school after Hurricane Ian thanking those functional support teams that assisted in preparing for the hurricane as well as the aftermath. There was minor damage to some of the buildings and facilities is already in process with the minor repairs. Dr. Ruiz updated the board on the collaboration with the National functional departments and the State teams including IT, the deputy directors, all spearheaded by Ana Cordal in collaboration.
- Hillsborough County Schools closed on Monday, September 26th while storm was still over Cuba, but the FCEF schools remained open until September 27th.
- Dr. Ruiz encouraged the board to keep the Lee County schools run by CSUSA in their thoughts and prayers as many of our staff and students suffered losses from the hurricane. CSUSA managed schools are collecting items for relief since there are still many people who lost everything.
- Dr. Ruiz informed the board that the principals' meeting was cancelled for this week to give an opportunity to Principals to take care of the relief efforts and getting back to normal.
- Dr. Ruiz commended all Principals for National Principals' Month and for all their hard work and making a difference for students.

TSIA Updates

- The board reviewed the FY23 TSIA plans submitted to the FL DOE and is currently under review for approval.
- For Clay County staff, this is their third increase with non-instructional staff receiving \$1,000.
- For Pasco County staff, this is their second increase. The plan included base pay minimum of \$47,500 and funds available for a \$1,000 bonus.

MOTION: Motion was made by Eric Johnson and seconded by Randy Walker to accept the State Director's Report, as presented. Motion was approved unanimously. (3-0, 2 absent)

MOTION: Motion was made by Eric Johnson and seconded by Randy Walker to ratify the TSIA Plans, as presented. Motion was approved unanimously. (3-0, 2 absent)

IV. FINANCIALS

Title I Budgets

- The board reviewed the Henderson Hammock Charter School Title I Budget.
- The board reviewed the Woodmont Charter School Title I Budget.

MOTION: Motion was made by Randy Walker and seconded by Eric Johnson to approve the Title I Budgets for Henderson Hammock Charter School, and Woodmont Charter School for the Florida Charter Educational Foundation, Inc. and Bay Area Charter Foundation, LLC, as presented. Motion was approved unanimously. (3-0, 2 absent)

V. OLD BUSINESS

School Calendar - Emergencies

- The board reviewed the communication procedures during an emergency event.
- Dr. Ruiz reviewed the procedures in place now and suggested for the board to have a conversation about the process.

- Board Director Eric Johnson commended everyone for doing a great during the last hurricane emergency. Would like to have board directions clarified since there was a lot of confusion as to when to close or not close the schools right before Hurricane Ian. The board does not have an emergency communication policy, but that CSUSA does have communications protocol. Each school has a crisis manual. Mr. Johnson expressed concern and would like to receive a quicker communication to the board as to what message is going to be conveyed out and to consider the board's standpoint before that message goes out. Mr. Johnson wanted to be able to respond to the on the ground stakeholders.
- Board Attorney Levi Williams shared with the board that arrangements will be made with CSUSA to create a communication process and procedures to follow when and emergency arises on communication to the board and its constituents.
- Mrs. Weaver informed the board that make up days will be looked at after hurricane season ends.

Renewal Updates

- The board discussed the Creekside Charter Academy renewal visit and that the district has a draft contract being circulated for edits which includes a 15-year renewal term. The district has indicated that the earliest the school renewal would be brought to the district is the December Hillsborough School Board meeting.

VI. NEW BUSINESS

Business Development Applications

- The board reviewed the three charter applications to be submitted to Lake County for an August 2024 opening.
 - Dr. Ruiz shared with the board that the schools built in these areas will be a K-8 model and have partnered with Groveland Cities already to build a collaborative process for the school districts to identify.

MOTION: Motion was made by Eric Johnson and seconded by Steve Knobl to approve the three charter applications from Florida Charter Educational Foundation, Inc. submission to Lake County School District, as presented. Motion was approved unanimously. (4-0, 1 absent)

K-8 Wellen Park Lease Agreement

- The board review the K-8 Wellen Park Lease Agreement. The charter for this not been approved and is still in appeal with the Florida State Board.
- Board Attorney Levi Williams shared with the board that this lease agreement meets legal form and sufficiency.

MOTION: Motion was made by Eric Johnson and seconded by Randy Walker to approve the K-8 Wellen Park Lease Agreement for Florida Charter Educational Foundation, Inc. and Bay Area Charter Foundation, LLC, as presented. Motion was approved unanimously. (4-0, 1 absent)

Innovation Preparatory Academy 2 5-8 Expansion Lease Agreement

- The board reviewed the Innovation Preparatory Academy 2 5-8 Expansion Lease Agreement. Rita updated the board Jeff Youngman at the Pasco County will ask senior leadership at the district if they are amenable to increasing the enrollment under the current Innovation Preparatory charter, which would be more efficient and allow the campus to have the two building but only one MSID number, budget, and

accountability. The board discussed that the board had previously requested expansion and was denied, however, it seems that now the district is willing to reconsider.

- Board Attorney Levi Williams shared with the board that this lease agreement has been approved for legal form and sufficiency.

MOTION: Motion was made by Dr. Steve Knobl and seconded by Eric Johnson to approve the Innovation Preparatory Academy 2 Expansion Lease Agreement for Florida Charter Educational Foundation, Inc., as presented. Motion was approved unanimously. (4-0, 1 absent)

Out of Field Waivers

- The board reviewed the Out of Field Waivers.

MOTION: A motion was made by Dr. Steve Knobl and seconded by Randy Walker to approve the Out of Field Waivers for the Florida Charter Educational Foundation, Inc. and Bay Area Charter Foundation, LLC., portfolio of schools, as presented. Motion was approved unanimously. (4-0, 1 absent)

The board considered amending the Board Meeting Calendar.

- Board Director Eric Johnson expressed concern about changing the schedule for the year and prefers eliminating one or two meetings as recommended. Mrs. Weaver will bring back to the board a suggested schedule of meetings to eliminate.


